A few months ago we blogged about a feminine pad initiative we did as a pilot with girls at some of CBM's vulnerable youth projects. One of our supporting churches in Canada sewed several washable pad packs that we then distributed to a group of teens, and this initiative has proven to be a quite impactful. It saves their families a significant amount of money and the girls found them more comfortable and usable than storebought sanitary napkins. It wasn't long before we had a list of mothers requesting packs for themselves as well.

Many times our projects focus on youth and children, but the hope is always to impact the whole family. Working with mothers around

feminine health and hygiene has been a great opportunity to do just that. This past month, after receiving another shipment of pad packs, we met with all of the interested mothers and trained them on how to use and care for their new washable pads.

Learn the Lingo

The Femenil, the women's chapter of the Bolivian Baptist Union, works to mobilize women across the country to know and serve God. Members of the Baptist World Alliance's Latin American Branch, the Femenil provides spiritual development for women,



highlights the contributions women make to the church body, and engages women in social justice ministries.

Femenil groups function at the local church, provincial, and national level and in this way are able to have regional as well as countrywide impact. Groups meet weekly for Bible studies in order to grow together in their faith, but also undertake various social projects which serve their congregations and communities.

In Bolivian churches, it is often the responsibility of these women's groups to raise and distribute the benevolent fund to those in need in the community. Consequently, these women are often most aware of the suffering and marginalized, and in turn mobilizing the

church to act on their behalf. For instance, one of CBM's most well know project, Casa de la Amistad, which works with prison children, started as an initiative of the Cochabamba Femenil chapter.
