On Sunday, November 30th, 1941 a fire engulfed Cote des Neiges Presbyterian Church doing significant damage.

The minister, Rev. H.A.Pritchard told the Montreal Gazette that overheated stovepipes appeared to have started the fire in the basement where, fortunately, no records or archives were kept.

The repairs would cost over \$8000—a substantial sum for the day.

It wasn't the first fire in the building, and it wouldn't be the last.

But the resilient people of Cote des Neiges would rebuild, and continue serving their Lord and their community without missing a beat—holding services in a rented facility the very next Sunday, and until their building was repaired.

As we celebrate our 159th anniversary the challenges are different. We might not quite be sure what the future holds, but the past has taught us that God faithfully responds when we trust Him through times of adversity.
